



Show and tell – a little presenter!

The aim of this activity is to practise communication and listening skills with your child. In this way, the development of the child's pronunciation and communication skills can be easily monitored.

What you need:

Any type of audio/video recording system (accompanied by toy or microphone-like object).

What to do:

- Together with your child, choose a topic your child is interested in (e.g. *Something I am good at*, *What I like/What I don't like*, *My favourite breakfast ...* etc.).
- Agree on the roles: your child will be the presenter; you will be a moderator; the rest of the family will be the audience.
- When recording, help your child by asking questions or support him/her by other material e.g. photos, drawings, objects.
- Do not force your child to speak, if he/she does not want to, but try to motivate and encourage. Do not interrupt your child when speaking.
- After recording, reflect together with your child what he/she is already able to achieve.

Some more ideas:

- You can also take a picture of your child speaking or record a short video where your child/children talk, play roles etc.
- Instead of recording what your child says, you can write down his/her words.
- After some time, you can return to the recording and together talk about the progress your child has made.
