Our starting point:

- Language learning pathways are becoming more and more diverse as a result of linguistic and cultural diversity.
- Many young people grow up with multiple languages and cultures,
 different practices and customs, different ways of speaking and writing.
- Even children growing up in historically monolingual countries and environments are exposed to more language influences than before.

At school I learn to read and write my home language, but I also learn English. I like to listen to songs in English.












Identifying the core aspects of the project

- The Questions & answers section provides the answers to a selection of questions that readers might have in relation to the project.






Language learning pathways


ILLEY – *Inspiring language learning in the early years* is an existing ECML resource that addresses two main questions:






Key ideas

GENERAL

- Key principles: General ideas about HOW children learn language and WHAT this means for PALINGUI (> link to ILLEY > shared principles)
- Key "methods" that are derived from the general ideas (WHAT matters and HOW language learning can be made visible): Observation, assessment and documentation
- **Key "actions":** concrete actions that are derived from key methods (identify, understand, support, show language learning)





The six key principles underpinning PALINGUI:

- Language learning actively relies on the existing linguistic repertoire of each child.
- Language learning is meaningful.
- Language learning is holistic.
- Language learning is active learning.
- Language learning is social-emotional learning.
- Language learning is progressive and continuous.

Key actions

The team has identified 4 key actions based on observation, assessment and documentation which enable children as well as their teachers and educators to become aware of their language learning and to progress on their language learning pathways:

- Identifying and becoming aware of language learning
- Understanding language learning
- Supporting language learning
- Showing language learning



Key actions explained - identifying

Your card reads Simone. There's an "n". This is a girl's name!

Identifying and becoming aware of language learning

- By looking at and listening to, what young children can achieve;
- By supporting young children to reflect on what they are able to achieve;
- By understanding and helping children to understand why and how they act as they do.



No, it is not! I'm a boy!

And it reads "Simon",

not "Simone"!

No!! It ends with an "n" . Just as "Joleen" ends with an "n"!!

No! No! It's French. You don't hear everything you see!

Key actions explained - understanding

Understanding language learning

- By discovering each child's existing linguistic potential and allowing each child to discover this by themselves;
- By linking prior to future learning steps;
- By linking language learning to young children's general development (including their interests, talents and needs) and by linking it to their learning in other areas;
- By linking language learning to (language) learning outcomes.






Key actions explained - supporting

Supporting language learning

- By creating meaningful learning opportunities which consider young children's developmental stages, interests, talents, needs, and prior language learning;
- By enabling children to be active agents and draw upon their whole linguistic repertoire.





- By enabling children and their parents as well as colleagues to become aware of learning and progress.


